ABSTRACT

SOUND AND SPIRITUAL SYMBOLISM IN JOHN MILTON'S "SAMSON AGONISTES", JOHN BUNYAN'S "PILGRIM'S PROGRESS" AND AUROBINDO GHOSH'S "SAVITRI"- A STUDY.

ABSTRACT : Sound symbolism denotes the idea that vocal sounds or phonemes carry meaning in and of themselves, where as spiritual symbolism denotes the deeper and inner meaning of certain words that fill our inner self with some sense of purpose and new explorations of inner voyage. My study aims at delving deep into meaning of some core words and their sound and spiritual symbolism and their relevance in our modern context. In this connection, I choose three works viz., John Milton's "Samson Agonistes", John Bunyan's "Pilgrim's Progress" and Aurobindo Ghose's "Savitri".
