Psychologically speaking, men has been taught or said or brought up in such a way saying that usually a woman says 'no' for sex. Some don't even know what rape is or that rape does exist. So when they try and woman objects they consider this a natural objection, nature of women and proceeds. And the most shocking finding is that in the case of child abuse, the most of abusers are who very much known to the child. The most trusted person by the family is the one who uses the opportunity and commits such as unforgivable crimes. In "The Babysitter" by the author Liza Rodman, Jennifer Jordan says the story of a young girl who was very much friendly with her charismatic babysitter, who was a serial killer. Technically speaking, the exploration of computers as a vehicle for criminal conduct, new drugs or pharmaceuticals influence, exposure of rawest form of violence in video games, film, television, social media for illicit activities. To be said in simplest form, they are "wired" to become criminals, says the author Stanton Samenow in "Inside the criminal minds". When psychologically analyzed on the offender there is also another angle left to be noticed where "The insult of an individual men can force or leads him to commits sin at any extent level of crime. The obsession of the love, ambition and violent crimes, could make the individual explore own violent and sexual fantasies", says the author Evan Connell in "The Diary of Rapist".

Expected results:

Is there any solution for such crimes to be stopped? Yes, through the sex education it could be attained. Trust nobody. Teach your children of how treat or behave with others whether it is boy or girl. Instead of taking class of self defense to girls take class of how to respect and treat a girl to your boys.
